After spending time researching art schools, determine your top 5 – 6 choices. Ideally these schools are in locations that are appealing to you, offer majors in areas you wish to focus, and display a level of student work that you are excited and inspired by. It's helpful if you feel your artwork and grades reflect what the schools are looking for, but it's not a bad idea to also reach for a school that feels competitive and may prove a challenge to be accepted to. Students who turned in paperwork for free and reduced lunch should see their guidance counselors as soon as possible to learn about possible application fee-waivers to help offset the cost. Also, sometimes schools will waive the fee if you make an appointment to visit in person. Be sure to research this carefully and/or speak to me about it further.
